B.CLIP

The B.PAC Civic Leadership Incubator Program (B.CLIP) is B.PAC's flagship initiative that intends to create a pool of informed civic leaders who will actively engage in ward level management and administration of the city to improve governance. B.PAC selects, trains, mentors and supports individuals through structured class-room sessions and field projects. These individuals can either contest municipal corporation elections or engage with the elected representatives or even help in individual capacity as concerned citizens to enable better governance. The program equips candidates with skills in public policy analysis, municipal administration, political landscape, election dynamics, media management, and other relevant knowledge.





The B.CLIP incubator program intends to create a network of candidates that B.PAC and other civil society organisations can work with to solve civic issues, and those found suitable can be endorsed in elections. B.CLIP aims to provide a platform for passionate citizens to enter public service and act as a pressure group to bring in transparency and accountability into the political and administrative system.

MISSION

1. To provide a platform for passionate citizens to enter political/public service
2. Create leadership capacity at the municipal level to enable better city governance
3. Create leaders with an interest in public service and a will to participate in the political process
4. Create leaders who understand the complexities and dynamics of managing a ward, a city and its activities
5. Create leaders to engage with citizens and interact with the political leadership on behalf of the citizens
6. Create leaders who can govern with accountability, transparency, and integrity

ADMISSION PROCESS

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

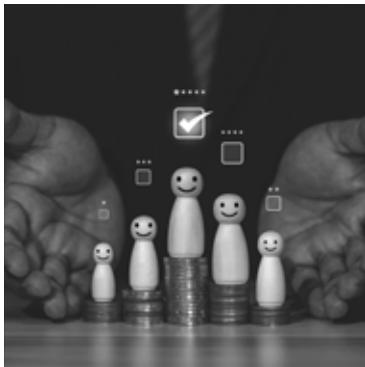
1. Eligible to vote for the BBMP election in their respective wards
2. Not disqualified under law from contesting elections
3. Not have any criminal cases against him/her and/or should not have been convicted in the court of law for serious offences
4. Not have any cases against him/her for molestation of women and children
5. Produce a signed list of 100 voters from his/her ward backing him/her, with their names, contact numbers and voter ID numbers
6. Demonstrate track record of competency, integrity and self-worth
7. Demonstrate passion for civic activities and a track record of public service, preferably in the same ward

STAGES OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS



STAGE 1: THE INITIAL STAGE

1. Outreach and Call for Applications
2. **Fill the Application:** Candidates fill the application form and submit a signed list of 100 supporting voters from their own ward



STAGE 2: INTERNAL SCREENING

Applications undergo an impartial, stringent, and rigorous screening process.



STAGE 3: URBAN GOVERNANCE TEST

The test evaluates the applicant's understanding of BBMP and the Government of Karnataka fundamentals



STAGE 4: PERSONAL INTERVIEW

Applicants are interviewed by a panel that assesses leadership qualities, political and economic awareness, engagement in on ground activities, and their vision for Bengaluru

Based on cumulative score and display of performance and leadership qualities, the panel selects 65 applicants for each batch.

CURRICULUM AND PEDAGOGY

The B.CLIP program is a comprehensive course with a mix of theory, practical, and on-field activities intended to provide the participants an overview of the political system, public policy, and public administration. The curriculum design and classroom sessions are done by Takshashila Institution in consultation and coordination with B.PAC.

The program is divided into two phases.

PHASE I: TRAINING FOR 3 MONTHS



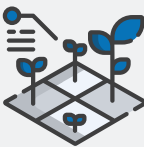
Theory Track

Basics of theory and knowledge that underpins urban governance, urbanisation, policy engineering, economic reasoning, decision making in government, ethics of public leadership and more.



Practice Track

Practical aspects of city administration, politics and electoral dynamics; Agenda for Bengaluru; municipal setup; inter-agency and intra-agency dynamics of BBMP; case studies in public problems, city politics, managing political campaigns and more.



Field Track

Individual and group exercises in home constituencies for participants to understand the complexity of public problems, safety of women, Parking, Road repair, Waste management and more.



Field Visit

Field visit is intended to give participants an exposure to the institutional process in BBMP for infrastructure projects, challenges encountered at the ground level and how they overcome the hurdles to complete and open it for public utilization. Field visit introduce B.CLIP participants to the aspect of urban civic infrastructure conceptualising, planning, co-ordinating, execution and monitoring the work.



Final Presentation

The participants will identify three problems in their ward and analyse the gap and will present the solutions to each of those issues to a panel and their cohort. The panel members score each of the presentations on the basis of their ability to analyse the problems and provide practical solutions to the same.

PHASE II: PROJECT WORK FOR 6 MONTHS

After completing the three-month sessions, participants embark on a project that involves the practical application of their classroom learning to real-life issues at the ward level. Their final presentation includes the identification of three specific problems within their ward, a comprehensive gap analysis, and the presentation of viable solutions for each issue to both a panel and their peers. The panel members evaluate each presentation based on the participants' ability to analyse problems effectively and propose practical solutions.

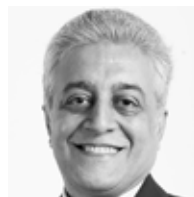

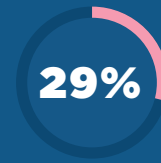

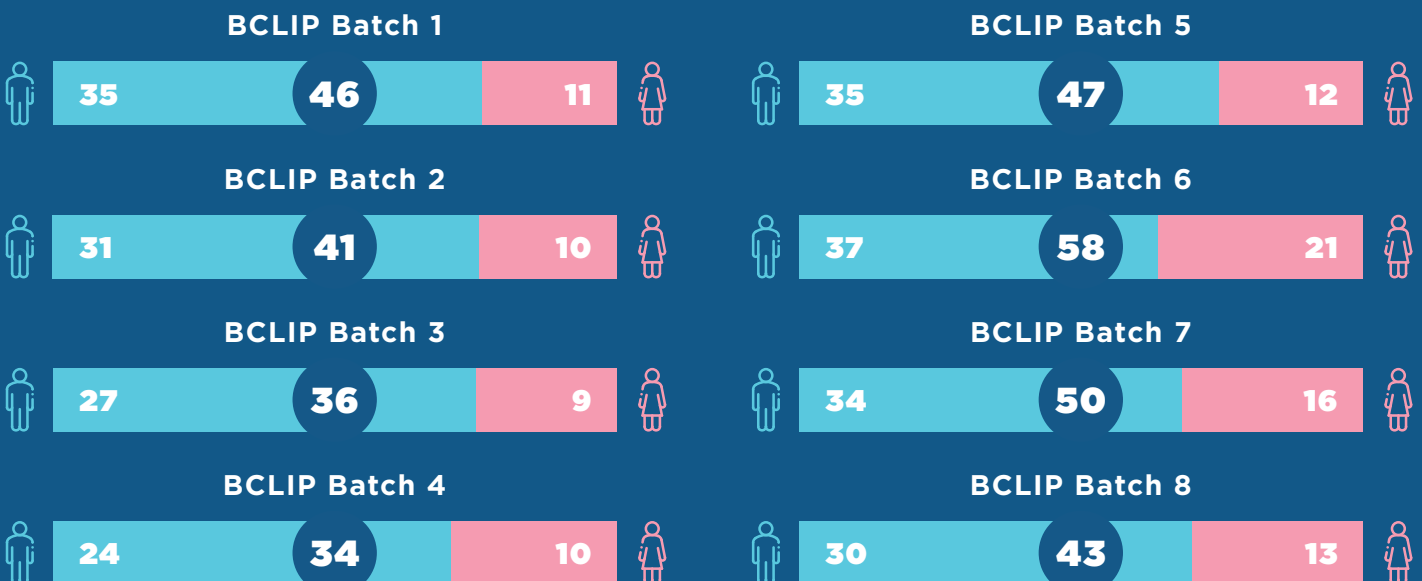

POLITICAL PARTY WISE REPRESENTATION

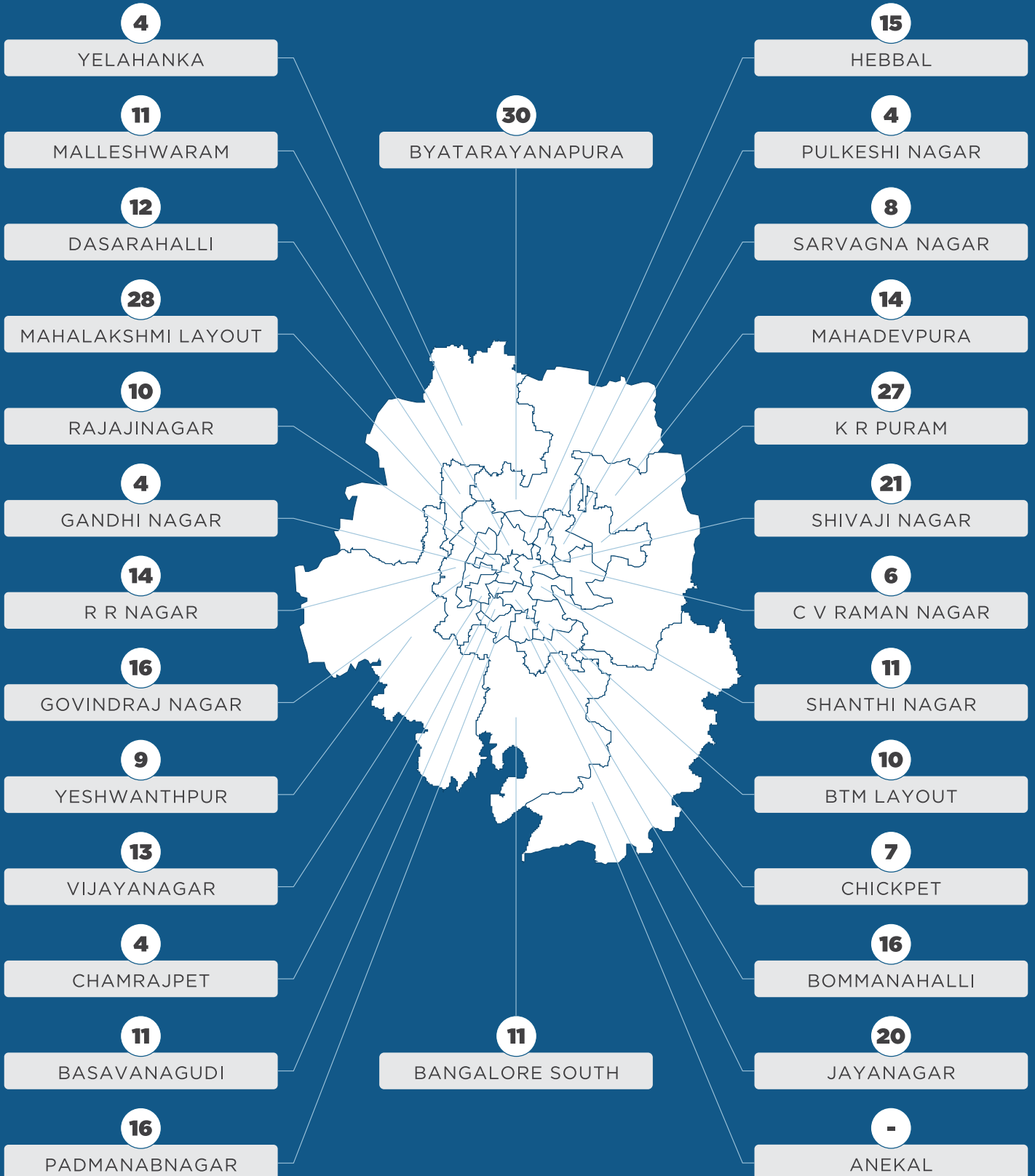

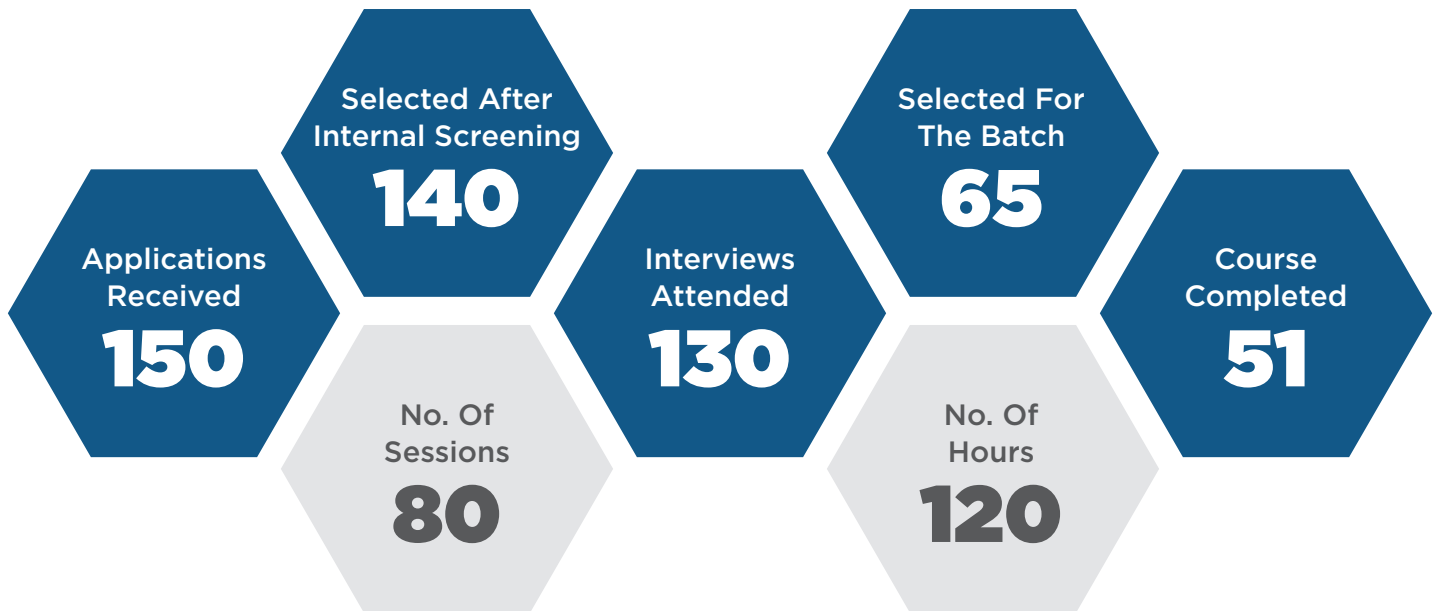

Education

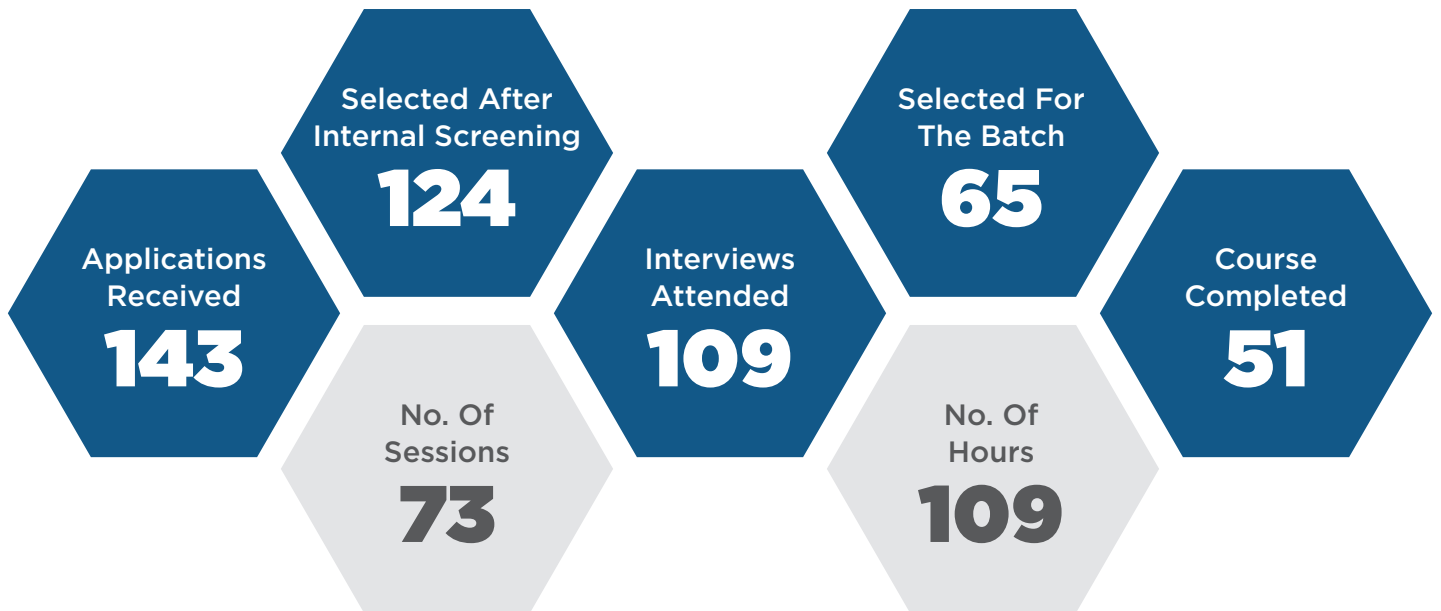
Civic Amenities

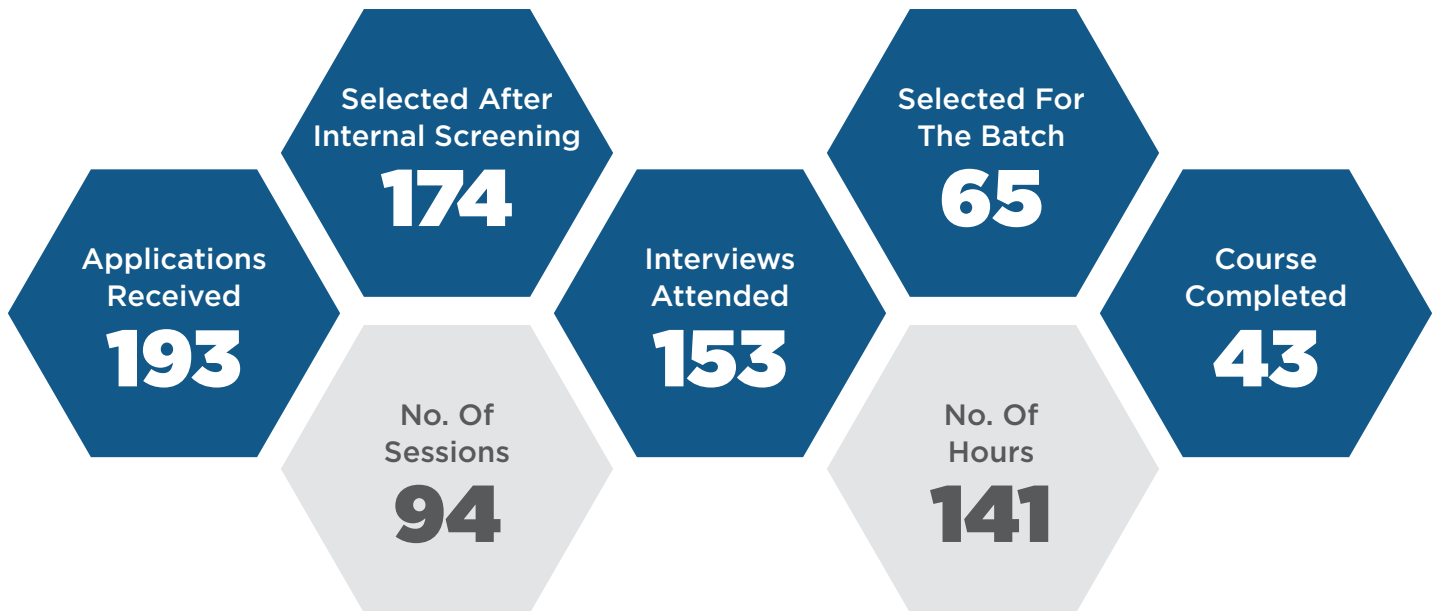
Civic Amenities

BATCH PROJECTS

Community

Libraries are essential community assets that promote knowledge, literacy, education, cultural enrichment, and social connections. Health

Environment

Rainwater harvesting is a low-cost and simple solution to address the challenge of water scarcity in Bengaluru. Recognizing its associated advantages, Mr. Jeevan L took up the initiative to construct recharge pits on roads in Girinagar ward, with the help of experts in the field. By implementing rainwater harvesting systems, the project promotes water conservation, reduces dependence on external water sources, and ensures the availability of clean water for various purposes within the community. It will also prevent flooding and replenish groundwater tables.
